Against Stillwater two weeks ago, the Rams appeared sluggish the first half, and by halftime found themselves down 37-19, to a team which was beaten only once.

Ramsey turned to a zone in the second half, gambling that the Ponies would miss from the outside. But forward Jeff McFadden hit nine out of ten from nearly the same spot and the Rams were wliminated from any chance

of a third straight conference title.

The "big men" led the Ram scoring, as usual. Junior Dan Carlson scored 17 and senior captain Bill Cafferty added 12. McFadden wound up with 23 to head a balanced Stillwater attack.

Against NSP last week the Rams were outhustled for three quaters and eventually lost a 50-48 decision. The Polars averaged a 58-49 defeat in December

a 58-49 defeat in December. The Blue and White looked sloppy the first half, losing the ball 13 times and losing the battle of the boards. But 50% shooting and ten NSP turnovers resulted in a 28-25 halftime lead.

Then the Ramsey offense broke down. The team could manage only five points the third quarter and trailed by nine going into the final period.



were good; good enough to place second in the conference; but not as exceptional as a fine Anoka team, which had a 12-0 record, compared to 10-2 for the Rams.



74. Kellogg-72, Ramsey-64. At 95 lbs, Ray Hermanson won his first three matches before losing to Kellogg's Costa, 2-0. At 103, Ramsey's Grady was pinned in the first round by Ingram of WBL. Jack Stutsman, at 112, also lost in the first round, 2-0. Tim Carlin, at 120, won 8-7, then lost 8-7. Things looked bright when Gary Kilgore won the championship at 127 by defeating Struntz of Kellogg,3-2. Guy Johnson, wrestling at 133, got to the finals before losing to Strand of South St. Paul, 3-1. At 138, Charlie Shiue, won 7-0, and lost by a pin. Ramsey appeared to be in bwd shape when Tom Flaherty, at 145, locked his knee during a semi-final match with Yurista of St. Anthony, losing by defaulr. His opponet went on to win the 145 lb. championship. Flaherty had previously pinned two opponents. Dan Hilger lost 7-4 in the 154 lb. weight class and Dan Barron also lost on a pin at 165. Undefeated Dan Johnson came on in the 175 lb. class to defeat opponents by a pin, 8-0, 7-0, and 3-0. His final win was over Armstrom of St. Anthony. Heavyweight Tom Maze had two pins then lost 6-1. Maze went to the consolation round and lost the consolation championship to Tombarge of St. Anthony, giving his fourth place in the heavyweight class.

Five in Region

Going on to Region 4 championships will be Ray Hermanson, second; Gary Kilgore, first; Guy Johnson, second; Dan Johnson, first; and Tom Maze, fourth making him the fifth Ram wrestler to go to Region. Kellogg and St. Anthony are sending six wrestlers each.
